- <u>Distribution</u>: Western North America
- <u>Color/Appearance</u>: Heartwood is reddish brown, sapwood is yellowish white.
- **<u>Grain/Texture:</u>** Straight grained with medium texture.
- <u>Common Uses:</u> Veneer, plywood, sheathing, subflooring, boxes, crates, posts/poles, interior trim, cabinetry, and construction lumber.

Cedar



- **Distribution:** Eastern North America
- <u>Color/Appearance</u>: Heartwood tends to be a reddish or violet-brown. Sapwood is a pale yellow color and can appear throughout the heartwood as streaks and stripes.
- <u>Grain/Texture:</u> Has a straight grain, usually with knots present. Has a very fine even texture.
- <u>Common Uses:</u> Fence posts, closet and chest linings, carvings, outdoor furniture, birdhouses, pencils, bows, and small wooden specialty items.
